That cute picture above is from the first year our school was open. Each day started with breakfast for the kids and was such a sweet time of coming together to share a meal before the school day started. Then came the pandemic and the school closure and a whole list of new rules. The breakfast program stopped.

Since that time, we've seen that our students need more food throughout the day, more food than their families can provide. El Salvador's economy is tied to the United States' economy, and as they say in El Salvador: "When the United States gets a cold, El Salvador gets pneumonia." They're facing difficult economic challenges right now, and the rising price of food is a big part of that.

To help, we're starting a lunch program for our older students who have a longer school day and a snack program for our Kindergarten students. In order to offer this lunch and snack program, we need to get our kitchen up to code, purchase plates and utensils, and hire people to prepare the food. It's a big undertaking, but it's necessary.

This year was big for us: Our 20th anniversary. To go along with that big celebration, we announced a big fundraising need, a new classroom building. Soon, we'll need to start construction to keep up with the growth of the school and our goal of adding one grade per year until our school serves students from Kindergarten through high school graduation.

The estimated cost of that building? **\$498,000**. We said it was a big need! But, if we've learned anything over the years of hosting our friends, it's that they come through in a big way. This year's luncheon raised **\$170,000**, which gives us a great start to accomplishing this goal. Thank you to all who gave, prayed, and helped. We couldn't do what we do without you.
